Hello Brothers and Sisters

I hope everyone is well. Wow what a beautiful winter we have had, I didn't get any snowmobiling in but did manage to get out ice fishing a few times.

We have been very busy at the hall, dispatching for K+S and the CCRL Shutdown. I apologize if somebody was in and didn't get a chance to talk to me. Please leave a message with Lori and I will be sure to call you back.

The Co-op Shutdown is scheduled to start Mar 28 and is expected to run for 38 days. Balzers and LML are both on site with a couple hundred men between them. I haven't heard whether Co-op is planning a fall shutdown.

Aecon Mining at the K+S Legacy Mine are continuing construction in the Loadout and the ECC. They have been hiring every couple of weeks. We have over 400 members on site, working a 14 and 7 shift with a camp available.

BFI is continuing construction at the Areva Site at McLean Lake. They are working on a 14 and 14 off shift. This is a fly in camp job with flights leaving from Saskatoon and Prince Albert.

We have had smaller calls in from CIMS Ltd. For Agrium and Mosaic Belle Plaine. Icon at Boundary Dam, MX2 at K+S Well Pads, also SMW at PCS Allan and Kusy's at Co-op.

Balzers is planning a Moose Jaw Asphault Shutdown in April. There is also a Boundary Dam and Shand Shutdown in April and May for SaskPower. We will also see men going to Key Lake for BFI.

Brandon, Mitch and I attended a Building Trades Organizing Seminar in Burnaby the first of March. There was some very good speakers and content. We learned some very good strategies for organizing non-union contractors.

Some of the topics included increasing morale, overhead work, mitigating risks, communication and coordination and to start being proactive instead of reactive. Our Shop Stewards are there to help protect your rights on site. Please treat them with respect. I have had many conversations about the camp with both disgruntled and happy members. Everything from mistreatment by security to poor food quality, parking lot congestion and just general mismanagement of check in and out lines and booking.

Aecon has asked for our help in managing bookings for camp. Day shift Shop Stewards will now confirm bookings for members both off and on site in coordination with Aecon's Human Resources.



SOUTHERN COMMERCIAL SECTOR & ORGANIZING REPORT

Hello Brothers and Sisters.

I have had an extremely busy fall & winter with all of the commercial work within Southern Saskatchewan & as usual organizing duties. Maybe one day in the future I will catch up on my workload it just hasn't happened yet.

UA Local 179 Commercial Sector Work in Southern Saskatchewan:

Sprinkler fitting work is as follows:

Bison Fire Protection is slow as they finished their contract out at the Rocanville PCS potash mine before Christmas.

Simplex Grinnell is steady with two sprinkler fitters working within Southern Saskatchewan at the Deveraux Condo's & Parliament Condo's. Their service division is currently slow with four sprinkler fitters doing work at Yara Belle Plaine, Saskpower maintenance agreement and deficiency work all over Southern Saskatchewan. As a result of the service slowdown a couple service sprinkler fitters are helping the construction division out with work. Although within the next couple weeks they will need up to 10 more sprinkler fitters on site at K+S. If anybody is interested in these upcoming jobs please contact me.

Viking Fire Protection is steady with work but will get busy within southern Saskatchewan with 11 sprinkler fitters working in Regina at the North Central Shared school facility, Bennett Dunlop Ford & soon at the 3-P3 schools in Regina and the Rivera Nursing Home. They also have three service vans doing work all over southern Saskatchewan and have hired a few sprinkler fitters over the past few months. They will be looking to hire soon for their upcoming workload.

Vipond Fire Protection is steady in southern Saskatchewan with 20 sprinkler fitters working within Regina at the Residence Inn, Harbour Point Condo's, Golden Mile renovation, STC Bus Garage, Hill Tower 4/AG Place, Villas on Houghton Condo, RCMP D Block and the U of R Residences. In Yorkton, they are working at the Home Hardware and Brightwater. In Swift Current, they are working at the Custom Truck's and the full line AG building. In Moose Jaw, they are working at the Moose Jaw Hospital, Walter Scott Building and the Brightwater senior care home. Their service department is busy with 11 sprinkler fitters working all over southern Saskatchewan doing service work.

Troy Life & Fire Safety is busy in southern Saskatchewan with 13 Sprinkler fitters working at the Roughrider Stadium, Swift Current Nursing Home and on service contracts throughout southern Saskatchewan. They have hired several Journeyman and apprentices within the last few months & they also have one service van taking care of southern Saskatchewan. They are looking to hire another Journeyman so if anybody is interested please call me at the union hall.

Refrigeration/Service Work is as follows:

Airtron Canada is very slow with 2 refrigeration mechanics working throughout southern Sas-

katchewan but they are bidding lots of service work.

Black & McDonald's service division is steady with a crew of four working all over southern Saskatchewan. They are currently working out some contract details to acquire a lot more service work which would entail hiring even more plumbers or refrigeration mechanics if they acquire the contracts. They are still looking for a Journeyman Plumber with Boiler Service Experience to start soon.

Christie Maintenance Services crew is steady with five refrigeration mechanics and five plumbers doing service work within Regina for ICR, Century Management, Rochdale Crossing, Victoria Jewellers, RQHR and the U of R. Within Estevan they have their crew at the Shand and Boundary Dam power station and all over southern Saskatchewan as well.

Cimco Refrigeration has hired a Journeyman refrigeration mechanic to help open up an office in Regina. I would like to thank John Clow for convincing his son-in-law to work union and recruit him over to Cimco Refrigeration.

Honeywell Controls is busy with three HVAC/refrigeration mechanics and one plumber doing service work all over Southern Saskatchewan including their big contracts of RBC, Scotiabank and Casino Regina. They hired another UA Local 179 Journeyman Refrigeration Mechanic due to having a Journeyman quit recently.

Johnson Controls is steady with three HVAC/refrigeration mechanics doing service work all over southern Saskatchewan including their big contracts of the Hill family owned buildings, Sun Country Health Region, SaskTel & the Northgate Mall. They have hired an apprentice recently due to an increased workload.

Standard Mechanical is steady with two HVAC/refrigeration mechanics doing service work all over Saskatchewan.

Plumbing work is as follows:

Black & McDonald is steady but picking up some work within Southern Saskatchewan with 10 plumbers/pipefitters in southern Saskatchewan working within Regina at the SGI corporate & operations office renovations & Evraz Place. Outside of Regina, they have picked up more work at Boundary Dam, the White City Water Treatment Plant & are still working on finishing the Moose Jaw Hospital. They will be looking for another apprentice soon.

C & E Mechanical is slow with 17 plumbers working within Southern Saskatchewan at the Estevan Court House, a few strip malls in Moose Jaw, Buffalo Pound Water Treatment plant & a boiler job. Their residential and light commercial service division is steady.

Christie Mechanical is steady with 10 plumbers working throughout Regina at Campion College (U of R), Lloyd Place renovation, Wascana Rehab sewer replacement and several smaller projects throughout Regina. They like all the other UA Local 179 commercial contractors are having a very difficult time competing against the many non-union contractors in southern Saskatchewan in all commercial markets now.

Discount Plumbing & Heating is slow with five plumbers doing service work, residential work and renovations all over Moose Jaw and surrounding area.

Edco Plumbing & Heating is busy with six plumbers working at finishing the Wascana Rehab renovation and a few smaller commercial jobs. As well as all of their ongoing service work for the Catholic School Board. As usual they are having a difficult time bidding against upwards of 15 non-union contractors on the 1 million & under market.

Lockerbie & Hole Contracting Limited/Lockerbie Stanley has five plumbers finishing out at the Regina Wastewater Treatment Plant within the next few weeks on the green side.

Marathon Mechanical is steady with two plumbers working within Regina at the Save on Foods, RCMP Works building & the SGI Chiller. The same as Edco, they are having a hard time competing against many non-union contractors. They hired another 4th year apprentice recently due to picking up some more work.

POW CITY Mechanical is getting busy with 15+ plumbers working within Regina at the Regina Airport, Orange tree in Harbour Landing, the P3 school's in Harbour Landing, Rosewood & Greens on Gardiner. Outside of Regina they are finishing the Swift

Current River View Condo complex. They have recently hired two UA Local 179 Journeyman Plumbers, three Permit Journeyman Plumbers, one Travel Card Journeyman Plumber and five probationary apprentices and will need more in the coming months but are still looking for green to fourth year apprentices. So if anybody is interested in working for Pow City please give me a phone call.

With all of this commercial work ongoing and in the future UA Local 179 contractors have left me with no choice but to continually recruit more permit plumbers and probationary apprentices to fill these jobs with appropriate manpower. Also in addition to this problem I have encountered issues many times in the past couple years & specifically in the last couple weeks where I have had many Journeyman Plumbers quitting to go and work on Industrial projects which leaves the commercial projects in a tough position and as a result most of those jobs have to be filled with a non-union plumber. So again just a heads up to all members that UA Local 179 will grow bigger in the size of our membership as a result of the current commercial workload.

We had a UA Local 179 commercial contractor get together in Saskatoon for all the Saskatchewan contractors and we had the majority of the commercial contractors show up and it was very informative for us. As a result of the meeting we were told that every UA Local 179 southern Saskatchewan commercial contractor is having a difficult time bidding against upwards of 15 non-union bidders on the 1 million & under market. Some small to medium size non-union contractors have grown bigger over the last several years and have now worked their way into the 5 million & under market. A couple medium sized non-union contractors have now grown into the 10 million & under market now so we have more competition on every level of the commercial sector within Southern Saskatchewan.

A good example is just recently the Riveria Retirement/Care home in Regina with a \$10,000,000 mechanical contract went to Waultten Mechanical a non-union company that has only been around since March 2010 & has grown their bondability to the over 10 million dollar market. Waultten acquired the job bidding over 1.2 million dollars less then every other UA Local 179 contractor. There was six non-union contractors on that bid and four UA Local 179 contractors. This is the first time that there has ever been that many non-union contractors in this market.

UA Local 179ers Slo-Pitch Team:

179ers southern Saskatchewan spring league slo-pitch will start again at the end of April on Thursday and Sunday evenings. This team is for all UA Local 179 members and spouses to play on.

UA Local 179 Sprinkler fitters:

I would like to thank Mike Chriest for setting up the Sprinkler Systems Installer Compulsory Trades Task force and having the Sas-katchewan Apprenticeship & Trade Certification Commission running the meetings. For those of you that don't know this is the fourth time that our trade has put an application into the Government of Saskatchewan with no success obviously in the past 30+ years.

I want to thank all of the Sprinkler Task Force for all of their time that they have put into these open houses, attending task force meetings and preparing the application for submission. Thank you Mike Chriest (Chairman), Bill Symons, Jon Schneider, Rob Christensen, Jonathan Horan, Ken Busch, Kelvin Andre, Todd Warner, Rick Paul, Gino Santoro & Ryan Barnard. Also I want to thank our UA National Sprinkler fitter Training Coordinator Steve Steele & CASA representatives Jamie McKenzie and Matthew Osburn for all of their help in preparing our application to the government of Saskatchewan.

The current status of the application is 95% complete and all we are waiting on is the revised support letter from the Saskatchewan Association of Fire Chiefs.

Organizing Update:

Mitch Grenier and I are always working on achieving certifications with non-union contractors but it is very difficult when we only have so much available time for organizing.

Our memorandum of understanding with **Modern Niagara Western** for Hill Tower 4 and the Roughrider Stadium is ongoing. We finally received the ruling from the Saskatchewan Labour Relations board stating that they recognize the Memorandum of Understanding as binding until it's expiry on June 17. Over the last few months Modern Niagara has hired 8 more UA Local 179 Journey-

man plumbers, 8 UA Local 179 apprentice plumbers, 7 probationary apprentices & 4 permit Journeyman plumbers. Most of these new hires were a result of Journeyman plumbers quitting recently. So I would like to thank again the 45+ UA Local 179 members for their commitment to UA Local 179 to make sure that the Roughrider Stadium is completed successfully.

I have been working on trying to unionize **Infinity Fire Protection** for the last couple years and finally with Bill Peters help we negotiated an agreement starting on March 31, 2016. I would like to welcome Infinity Fire Protection to UA Local 179. Infinity Fire currently has 4 UA Local 179 sprinkler fitters working for them.



I apologize for anybody that I missed and I encourage all UA Local 179 members to do the same so we can organize more contractors.

NORTHERN COMMERCIAL SECTOR & ORGANIZING REPORT

Brothers and Sisters

With the last few months being slow, I believe that's about to change, up in the north and it's going to get extremely busy for me in the Commercial Sector.

As I've said at the last couple of Union Meetings the demand for Commercial Plumbers and also Sprinklerfitters will be huge. Almost all of our members in both of these two sectors are currently employed so to accommodate the calls that will be coming in for our unionized contractors I'm going to have to out source. I know this is a bone of contention with some and there has been lots of discussion and ideas put forward, but we will still have to grow our membership.

Taking travel cards is a good idea only if they are willing to come into the province in the Commercial Sector and are willing to work in our province without getting paid Sub. Our contractors are local and they bid these jobs so tight just to get them, that there is no allowance for LOA or Sub to accommodate out of province Union Brothers.

This being said it leaves me or Landon in the South no choice but to hire locally within the province to fill the calls. Like I've stated at the Union meetings this can be positive thing in regards to that I mean stealing key guys from the non-union shops hurts them and helps us. Also, if these trades people we take become members they will be helping our Pension and H & W grow as opposed to having a travel card come from out of province and just pay travel card dues to our local. That in itself is a huge difference to our local financially.

And thirdly as much as I hate to say this it will grow our local and meet the requirements of the international to grow all of the U.A. both across Canada and the United States.

We are a local that believes in being the best that we can be and what I mean about this statement is we stand behind our members to excel and exceed in growth and knowledge. In closing....

I wrote about our future manpower demographic crunch in previous articles. I believe this needs to be restated.

One of my roles as your Director of Training is to look ahead and plan for the future. I do and am planning to ensure this Local and signatory Contractors will have a fighting chance to have a stream of candidates we can train and mentor in the years ahead. There are many of our members that will be either retiring or semi retiring in the very near future. It does not appear to mean much to some of our members, and I get that. It does however mean a lot to our Local and signatory contractors and the UA.

It takes a minimum of 4 years for an individual to go from a probation apprentice to Journey status. It takes another 5 years for those individuals to become skilled in their trade. I am not making this up. Management of our human resources is tough work. The future depends on us getting it right now so that we have the number of members to meet the needs of not only today, but in the future.

The other choice is to do nothing and suffer the consequences of no action. To me, it is simple logic to work with the fastest growing demographics to ensure we have a large pool of potential talent to replace the many that will be retiring in the next 3 to 5 years. Beyond the 3 to 5 year look ahead, it gets worse. We are on the right track and moving forward for the betterment and future of the United Association and signatory Contractors we work with.

I have had a few members chat with me over concerns about this initiative. I believe most are concerned over process things such as the application of the working rules and bylaws. I get that. I am on the same page as those who have expressed these concerns. We need to follow our own rules. We also need to understand that the cold hard facts are that we need to ensure that we have the people in our system to effectively be proactive and not reactive.

In closing, I encourage all members to take the time to learn new skills, refine existing ones, and mentor our younger members in a proper manner that promotes doing things the right way, with the proper tools, and in a safe and productive manner. That is what Apprenticeship is all about. It is the responsibility of every Journeyperson to mentor and show our up and coming Apprentices the tips, tricks, and methods of properly doing the work that we do on the job sites.

Mentoring is what Journey people do. None of us are borne knowing the multitude of trade related tasks we perform each and every day. For this there are Journey people to take the time on the job with our Apprentices. Each Apprentices goes to trade school to learn the theory aspect. The hands on skills is what happens on the job with the Journey people.
